The PEACE (Process of English and Civic Education) curriculum at <http://www.caliteracy.org/education/esl-civics/index.html> is a low-level ESL curriculum incorporating civics education. It inspires students to use their emerging language skills to problem-solve and apply their lessons outside of the classroom. The 14 units include personal info, the American school system, community, housing, consumer info, money management, emergencies & disasters, safety, parenting, health, employment, environment, and government & legal system. Each unit covers objectives, vocabulary, reading/comprehension check, conversation practice, pronunciation, and grammar points. The first nine units can be downloaded free. 8/05
